- Freedom of thought, conscience and religion, and freedom to express your beliefs

- The right to marry and to start a family
- The right not to be discriminated against in respect of these rights and freedoms
- The right to peaceful enjoyment of your property
- The right to an education
- The right to participate in free elections
- The right not to be subjected to the death penalty
